

Articles of Special Interest

BOOK REVUE by Ken Howard: *Tracing the Chili Line Railroad to Santa Fe* by Mike Butler



Butler documents the history of the narrow gauge Denver & Rio Grande Railroad line from Antonio, Colorado to Santa Fe, New Mexico. The book is organized into chapters that document each important segment of the line including: 1) a richly illustrated description of each section of line, its construction and operation, 2) a guide book if the reader wants to trace the now abandoned right-of-way, and 3) sections on interesting characters who were involved with the history of the railroad. Several maps are included to help the reader relate the 1880-1941 railroad to the modern highway system and area of interest (Taos, pueblos, etc.)

I found the book very interesting from both historical and technical perspectives. The author really dug into the New Mexico photo archives to document the D&RG operation. There are great shots of stations, order boards, signals, section houses, storage buildings, trestles and bridges, steam power, and rolling stock spanning the 1880s to 1940s. Because I am modelling the D&RG on my home layout, I found this reference particularly relevant for building models representative of the period. Don't buy the book if you are looking for specifications on rolling stock or locomotives, but if you're interested in western narrow gauge history, it's a fun read.

The book was published in 2020 and is available from Amazon, or other sellers for about \$25.00.

Ken Howard would like to refer members to the following documentary about the Arctic rail lines of Alaska and Yukon Territory:

The video is an hour and 30 minutes in long and highlights the history of the region and the development of the railroad lines built to serve the gold rush and other mining ventures in the Arctic. Good action footage of the surviving railroads (Alaska – White Pass and Yukon) is included along with lots of photos of the smaller roads that did not survive when mining ceased. I was surprised at the number of short lines that were actually built in the early 1900s.

Tom Magnani submitted the following link from U-Tube on British steam locomotives and particularly the very beginnings of locomotive development. This video of the world's first operating locomotive replica the Trevithick built in Colebrickdale, England by an insurance company and donated to this museum. Running time is about 1 minute, but there are lots of pictures and links to other steam related videos.

Tom Magnani sent an additional U-Tube link to a 1948 steam locomotive explosion in Ohio. The video by TA Productions is only a few minutes, but shows the explosive power of big boilers.

4. Report on Club Renovations to Roof – Mike Keelean.

It was suggested that the Club buy a case, use what is needed to fix the problem and sell the rest to George Lasley.

5. Outlook for Spring and Summer, 2021 – Clif Kelly.

George Lasley gave a report on the "Spring into Trains Show."

At this time there are only 25-30 tables remaining for sale of the 155 total. Following the meeting George updated the available table count to 12.

If the TCA is unable to sell their tables to their members and we need them, we may buy back a block of 12 tables.

We need all hands on deck to help with this show. This appeal for help will continue to be made as we get closer to the show dates.

We would like to have an open house in July. This may not be possible due to Covid restrictions in place at that time.

We were asked if we had considered hosting birthday parties. At this time Covid restrictions will prevent us from doing this.

We were reminded that elections are coming up.

The nominating committee will be charged at the March Board meeting.

The nominations will be presented in April and the election will be held at the May Membership Meeting.

5. Call for Articles and Pictures of Interest for the Whistle Post – Clif Kelly.

The membership is reminded that we need content for the Whistle Post.

There was discussion about the Alaska Railroad video link.

Ken Howard reiterated that additional content will make the Whistle Post more than just the minutes of our meetings.

Tom Garren reminded everyone that the Webmaster needs updated descriptions of the Lego, S and G scale layouts for the website. Please send these to Bernie Dawson, club webmaster.

7. New Business – Clif Kelly.

Mike Johns requested money to fund the construction of a yard on the HO layout.

Tom Garren made a motion to authorize up to \$400.00 to fund this project. Should more funds be needed the HO committee will come back to the Board with an additional request.

The motion was seconded by Mike Keelean. It passed unanimously.

There was a discussion about the addition of a turntable to the HO layout. No conclusion was reached so John Spach made a motion to table this issue. It was seconded by Mike Keelean and passed unanimously.

This picks up on John Ragan's concern.

We advertise that the Clubhouse will be open from 10:00 am - 2:00 pm on Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays. There seems to be a problem keeping the club open for this time period, especially from 12:00 - 2:00 pm.

After much discussion, it was suggested that a signup sheet needs to be created to allow members to sign up for shifts during our advertised open hours at the Clubhouse.

This will be discussed further at the Membership Meeting on February 18.

8. Adjournment.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:05 pm.
